

DELIVERANCE HUB CORE BELIEFS

1. THE SUFFICIENCY OF THE TRINITY, THE CROSS, AND THE FINISHED WORK OF CHRIST

At Deliverance Hub, we believe that **the Triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—is entirely sufficient** for salvation, sanctification, deliverance, and Christian living.

We affirm that **Jesus Christ is the only way to the Father**, and that **the cross, the shed blood of Jesus, His resurrection, and His victory over sin and darkness are fully sufficient**. Nothing needs to be added to the finished work of Christ.



Key Scriptures:

- John 14:6 – “I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.”
- Colossians 2:10 – “You are complete in Him...”
- Hebrews 10:14 – “For by one offering He has perfected forever those who are being sanctified.”
- Colossians 2:15 – Christ “disarmed principalities and powers... triumphing over them.”

What We Reject

Because we believe in the sufficiency of Christ’s finished work, we **do not endorse teachings that require additional spiritual systems, realms, rituals, or legal processes** in order for the believer to obtain freedom or victory.

For example, we do **not** agree with the teaching of “**Courts of Heaven**” or “**Return to Hebraic Roots**” as a required procedure to secure deliverance or breakthrough.

If the work of the cross was truly enough—and Scripture declares that it was—then **no extra steps, courts, legal cases, or spiritual technologies** can add to or complete what Christ already accomplished.

Key Scripture:

- John 19:30 – “It is finished.”
- Galatians 5:1 – “It is for freedom that Christ has set us free; do not be entangled again...”

2. THE SIMPLICITY OF THE GOSPEL AND THE BELIEVER'S AUTHORITY IN CHRIST

At Deliverance Hub, we believe in the **simplicity and purity of the Gospel**. We acknowledge that **we were sinners**, and that **Jesus Christ died for us**, attaining **complete and final victory on the cross**. Through His finished work, salvation and deliverance are not complicated formulas—they are the result of Christ's sacrifice and resurrection.

When we are **dead to ourselves and alive in Christ**, Scripture affirms that we share in **His authority**. The **same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead** dwells in every believer—not partially, not in degrees, but in **His fullness**. This indwelling gives us a clear **advantage** in spiritual warfare and grants us **authority over all powers and principalities** through Jesus Christ. Someone who has been saved for 5 minutes has the **same authority** as someone that has been doing deliverance for 30 years.

Key Scriptures:

- Romans 6:11 – “Count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.”
- Romans 8:11 – “The Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you.”
- Ephesians 1:19–20 – The same power that raised Christ is at work in us.
- Luke 10:19 – “I give you authority... over all the power of the enemy.”
- Colossians 2:15 – Christ has already disarmed principalities and powers.

3. THE SUFFICIENCY OF CHRIST OVER SPIRITUAL REALMS, HIERARCHIES, AND COMPLEX TEACHINGS

At Deliverance Hub, we do not believe that **extensive teachings about spiritual hierarchies, demonic ranks, astral planes, or the naming and categorizing of demons** are required for victory. Scripture does not teach that freedom depends on specialized knowledge of the unseen realm. We hold that **a demon is a demon**, and that **every demon is subject to the authority of Jesus Christ**.

Because the Cross and the Blood of Jesus are fully sufficient, **every believer has full authority and full victory in Christ**, regardless of their level of spiritual knowledge or education.

Key Scriptures:

- Colossians 2:15 – Christ has already disarmed principalities and powers.
- Philippians 2:9–10 – Every knee must bow at the name of Jesus.



- Luke 10:19 – Believers are given authority over all the power of the enemy.

Repentance and Forgiveness Are Simple, Not Complex

We affirm that a believer's victory is **not determined** by:

- long lists of confessions
- remembering every sin committed in the past
- calculated or formula-driven prayers
- repentance reaching “before Adam” or into imagined realms

Instead, victory comes through the **simplicity of a lifestyle of Biblical repentance**—confessing what the Holy Spirit brings to awareness and surrendering the rest to God. This is sufficient because **God is all-powerful, all-knowing, and all-sufficient.**

Key Scriptures:

- 1 John 1:9 – “If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive...”
- Psalm 103:12 – God removes our sins “as far as the east is from the west.”
- Acts 2:21 – “Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.”

Salvation and Restoration Do Not Require Non-Biblical Rituals

We reject teachings that require **non-biblical repentance rituals**, extreme renunciations, or spiritual procedures in multiple realms for a person to be accepted into the Kingdom of God.

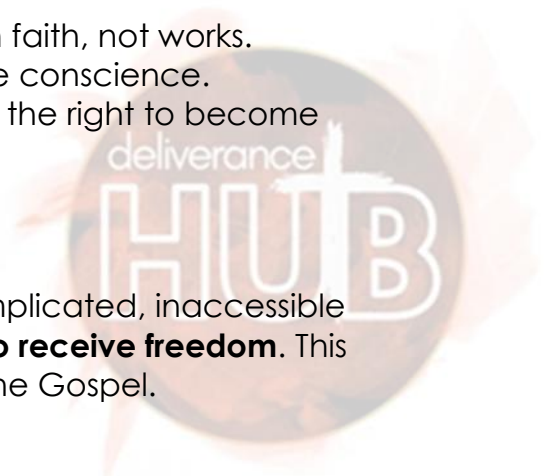
The Bible teaches clearly that people enter the Kingdom through **repentance, faith, and surrender to Jesus Christ**, and that sins are forgiven by the **blood of Jesus** alone.

Key Scriptures:

- Ephesians 2:8–9 – Salvation is by grace through faith, not works.
- Hebrews 9:14 – The blood of Christ cleanses the conscience.
- John 1:12 – Those who receive Christ are given the right to become children of God.

The Simplicity of the Gospel Protects All People

We believe that if salvation and victory required complicated, inaccessible teachings, then **most of the world would be unable to receive freedom.** This contradicts the nature of God and the simplicity of the Gospel. Therefore, we affirm that:



- **Jesus is enough**
- **the Cross is enough**
- **the Blood is enough**
- **the Holy Spirit is enough**
- **the Father's love is enough**

Key Scripture:

- 2 Corinthians 11:3 – "...the simplicity that is in Christ."

4. THE FINISHED WORK OF CHRIST AND THE REJECTION OF "LEGAL RIGHTS" THEOLOGY

At Deliverance Hub, we do not believe in the doctrine of **legal rights** as it is commonly taught in some deliverance movements. Scripture teaches that **all legal demands, accusations, and spiritual records of debt were nailed to the cross of Christ**, fully cancelled by His sacrifice.

Key Scripture (explicitly stating this):

- **Colossians 2:14** – "...having cancelled the record of debt with its legal demands, He set it aside, **nailing it to the cross.**"

Because Christ has removed the legal grounds of accusation, the belief that demons continue to operate through "legal rights" in the life of a born-again believer becomes a system that unintentionally keeps people **in bondage, self-inspection, fear, and striving**. Such teachings cause people to measure their salvation and victory by **immediate circumstantial improvement and feelings over faith**, rather than by the finished work of Jesus.

Circumstances Do Not Define Salvation or Victory

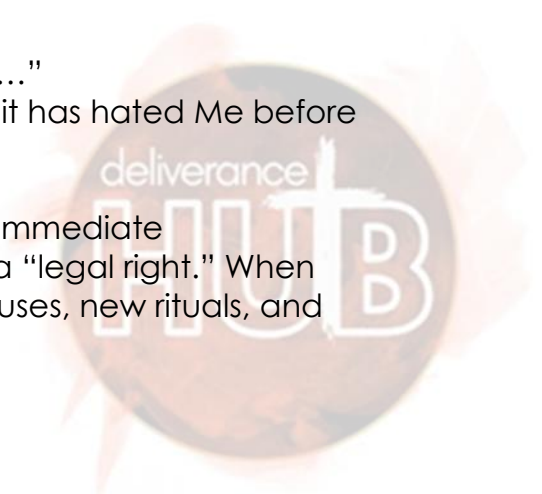
The Bible is clear that the presence of hardship does not indicate a lack of deliverance or salvation. Suffering is part of the Christian life.

Key Scriptures:

- John 16:33 – "In this world you will have trouble..."
- John 15:18 – "If the world hates you, know that it has hated Me before it hated you."

Because difficulties are guaranteed, the absence of immediate breakthrough **cannot** be interpreted as evidence of a "legal right." When people assume this, they begin searching for new causes, new rituals, and new steps—deepening the cycle of bondage.

Illustration of False Ownership



If a criminal breaks into a house, he does not become the legal owner. Likewise, if the enemy attacks a believer, it does not mean he possesses legitimate rights or ownership. In Christ, believers are **completely transferred into a new Kingdom** and do not belong to darkness in any capacity.

Key Scripture:

- 2 Corinthians 5:17 – “If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has passed away...”

Holistic Biblical Ministry

We affirm ministering to the **whole person—body, soul, and spirit**—with prayer, discernment, compassion, and biblical wisdom. Human beings are integrated, and ministry should reflect that integration. However, treating the whole person does not require adopting non-biblical legal-rights frameworks.

Sickness Is Not Automatically a Spiritual Issue

At Deliverance Hub, we do not believe that **every sickness or disease automatically has a spiritual origin or that all psychiatric or neurological issues are demonic**. We live in a fallen world, and even devoted Christians experience physical limitations, aging, illness, and natural weaknesses.

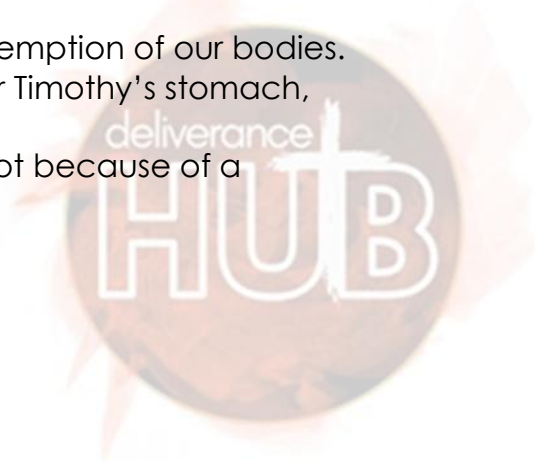
There is no biblical promise that all Christians will:

- be fully healed in every area,
- never experience illness,
- never need glasses,
- never lose hair, or
- be exempt from ordinary human frailty.

Scripture teaches that our bodies remain subject to mortality, even while our spirits are renewed.

Key Scriptures:

- 2 Corinthians 4:16 – “Our outer self is wasting away, yet our inner self is being renewed day by day.”
- Romans 8:22–23 – We “groan” awaiting the redemption of our bodies.
- 1 Timothy 5:23 – Paul recommends a remedy for Timothy’s stomach, showing sickness is not always demonic.
- Philippians 2:27 – Epaphroditus was gravely ill, not because of a demon.



Summary

Because of the cross of Christ, there is **no remaining legal documentation** empowering the enemy over a believer's life. Victory rests on Christ's finished work—not on human striving, perfect circumstances, or the removal of all physical imperfections. Our faith is grounded in **grace**, not in complex systems that place additional burdens on the people of God.

5. OPEN DOORS, HUMAN RESPONSIBILITY, AND ALIGNMENT WITH THE WORD OF GOD

At Deliverance Hub, we believe that the devil has **no inherent rights** over a believer's life. The only influence he gains is through **open doors**, which are wilful actions, agreements, behaviours, or spiritual submissions that grant him access. These are not “legal rights” in a judicial sense, but **choices of the believer that create vulnerability**.

What We Define as Open Doors

Open doors include, but are not limited to:

- any form of **occult involvement or occult practices**,
- **wilful sin** or ongoing disobedience to God,
- **ungodly sexual relationships**,
- **drug abuse** or behaviours that weaken spiritual discernment,
- engaging in activities that **open a person to the spiritual realm** apart from the Holy Spirit,
- **spiritual submission to ungodly or abusive leadership**.

These are choices that place a believer outside of God's protective alignment and into spiritual environments where the enemy can influence, tempt, or torment.

Key Scriptures:

- Ephesians 4:27 – “Do not give the devil a foothold.”
- 1 Peter 5:8 – The adversary seeks whom he may devour (implying not all are devour able).
- Romans 6:16 – We become slaves to whomever we obey.

The Believer's Responsibility in Sanctification

We believe it is every believer's responsibility to **close open doors** and to align their **body, soul, and spirit** with:

1. **The Word of God**,
2. **The work of Jesus on the Cross**,
3. **Dying to themselves and living in Christ**,



4. **Renewing their minds** through Scripture.

Sanctification requires intentional participation. While salvation is a free gift, spiritual maturity requires **obedience, surrender, and transformation**.

Key Scriptures:

- Romans 12:2 – “Be transformed by the renewing of your mind.”
- Luke 9:23 – “Deny yourself, take up your cross daily, and follow Me.”
- Galatians 5:16 – Walk by the Spirit and you will not gratify the flesh.
- 1 Thessalonians 5:23 – God sanctifies us “body, soul, and spirit.”

Summary

We believe that the devil cannot force himself upon a believer who is walking in alignment with Christ. Influence enters only where **doors remain open**, and it is the believer’s biblical responsibility to close those doors through obedience, repentance, and the renewing work of the Holy Spirit.

6. BIBLICAL PRACTICES WITHOUT RITUALISM: CHRIST AS THE FINAL AUTHORITY

At Deliverance Hub, we follow the **Biblical instructions** concerning the armour of God, the application of the Blood of Jesus, baptism, and communion. However, we do **not** practice or promote these elements in a **ritualistic**, formula-driven, or magical manner. Their power lies not in the action itself, but in **Christ**, who is the final and absolute authority over every spiritual power.

Christ Alone Holds the Power

We affirm that **no anointing oil**, regardless of where it comes from—including specially mixed oils from Israel—possesses more power than the **presence, touch, and authority of Jesus Christ**. The effectiveness of prayer and ministry flows from **Him**, not from man-made objects like shofars or Jewish objects, formulas like religiously putting on the armour as an insurance policy for protection, or symbolic tools like water baptism and communion.

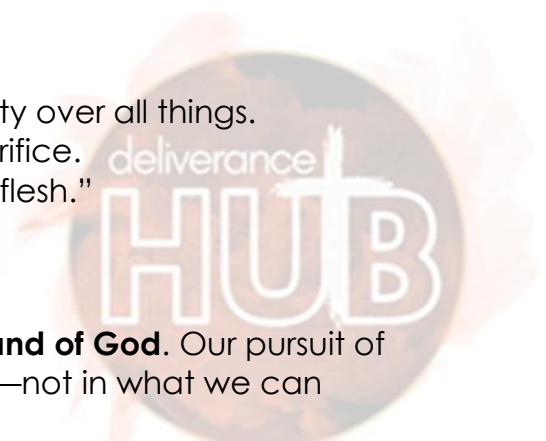
Key Scriptures:

- Colossians 1:18 – Christ is the head and authority over all things.
- 1 Samuel 15:22 – Obedience is better than sacrifice.
- Philippians 3:3 – We “put no confidence in the flesh.”

Pursuing the Heart of God, Not the Hand of God

We believe in **seeking the heart of God above the hand of God**. Our pursuit of Jesus is grounded in relationship, devotion, and love—not in what we can gain from Him.

People must fall in love with Jesus again, not merely approach Him to secure:



- financial breakthrough,
- healing for loved ones, or
- circumstantial improvements.

These petitions are welcome in prayer, but they **do not define** the foundation of our faith.

Key Scriptures:

- Matthew 6:33 – Seek first the Kingdom of God.
- Psalm 27:4 – “One thing I ask... to dwell in the house of the Lord.”
- John 6:26–27 – Jesus rebukes pursuing Him only for miracles or benefits.

Rejecting Man-Made Rituals

We do not practice or endorse **man-made rituals**, repetitive formulas, or mechanical spiritual procedures. Biblical acts such as anointing, communion, or the armour of God are **expressions of faith**, not magical acts or compulsory rituals.

A Deep Personal Relationship with God

We believe that Christianity is rooted in **intimacy with God**. Through His Spirit:

- we hear His voice,
- we are guided into truth,
- we receive empowerment for ministry,
- and we are transformed in our inner being.

The Holy Spirit was **poured out on all flesh**, and every believer has access to the presence, guidance, and empowerment of the Spirit of God.

Key Scriptures:

- John 10:27 – “My sheep hear My voice...”
- Acts 2:17 – The Spirit is poured out on all believers.
- Acts 1:8 – The Holy Spirit empowers us for ministry.
- Galatians 5:25 – “Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.”

Summary

Our faith practice is relational, not ritualistic. Christ alone is the source of power, authority, and transformation. We pursue Him not for His benefits but for His heart, and we trust the Holy Spirit to lead, guide, and empower us each day.



7. HUMILITY, EQUALITY IN THE BODY OF CHRIST, AND THE REJECTION OF EXALTING TITLES

At Deliverance Hub, we do not believe in the elevation or exaltation of **titles** within the Body of Christ. While the Bible acknowledges functions, callings, and spiritual gifts, it does not teach that one believer is inherently superior to another. We affirm that **every believer is a member of the Body**, equal in value, dignity, and access to God.

Equal Members of One Body

We believe we are all:

- **part of the same Body,**
- **bought by the Blood of Jesus,**
- **saved by grace alone,**
- **dependent on Christ,** not on status or title.

No part of the Body is “higher,” more important, or more spiritual than another. Each has a different function, but all have equal worth.

Key Scriptures:

- 1 Corinthians 12:12–25 – The Body has many parts, none more important than another.
- Ephesians 4:4–6 – One body, one Spirit, one hope, one Lord.

Christ Alone is Exalted

We believe that **the only man who ever deserved every title, crown, and honour is Jesus Christ**. The One who truly carried all authority walked this earth 2,000 years ago, and we call Him Lord. He alone is worthy of exaltation.

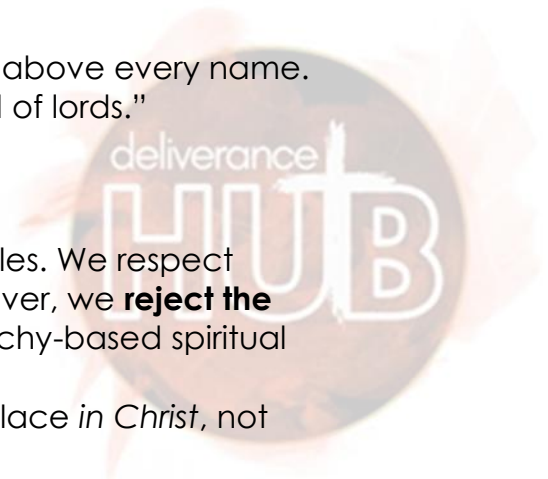
Key Scriptures:

- Matthew 23:8–12 – “You are all brothers... whoever exalts himself will be humbled.”
- Micah 6:8 – Walk humbly with your God.

Summary

Deliverance Hub stands against title-based superiority, spiritual elitism, and man-centered honour systems. Christ alone is exalted. All believers are equal members of His Body, called to walk in humility, grace, and devotion to Jesus.

8. REJECTING SHOWMANSHIP, PROTECTING DIGNITY, AND UPHOLDING BIBLICAL DELIVERANCE AND PROPHETIC MINISTRY

At Deliverance Hub, we do not believe in **showmanship** in ministry. We reject any form of glamorization of deliverance or the prophetic, and we do not support platforms that turn spiritual ministry into spectacle, entertainment, or public humiliation.

The Ministry of Christ Was Gentle and Restorative

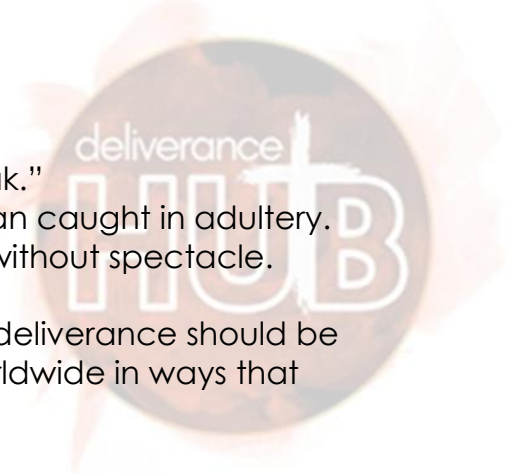

Therefore, we do not believe that people undergoing deliverance should be placed on stages, filmed, or broadcast into homes worldwide in ways that strip them of dignity or privacy.

No Platform for Demons



We do not believe in **extended conversations with demons** during deliverance.

Demons are:

- liars (John 8:44),
- deceivers,
- manipulators,
- and never worthy of a platform or a voice.

We refuse to give demons airtime or authority by engaging in dialogue that elevates their message. Deliverance belongs to **Jesus**, not to the theatrics of demonic manifestations.

Upholding Biblical Prophetic Ministry

At Deliverance Hub, we **do not reject the prophetic**. We believe strongly in the operation of the Holy Spirit. However, we **reject** prophetic ministers who are:

- self-centred,
- narcissistic,
- power-hungry,
- money-driven,
- image-focused,
- or seeking worship and adoration.

Any prophetic ministry that becomes an object of celebrity, fame, or financial manipulation stands in contradiction to the Spirit of Christ as a destructive spirit of divination and witchcraft.

Key Scriptures:

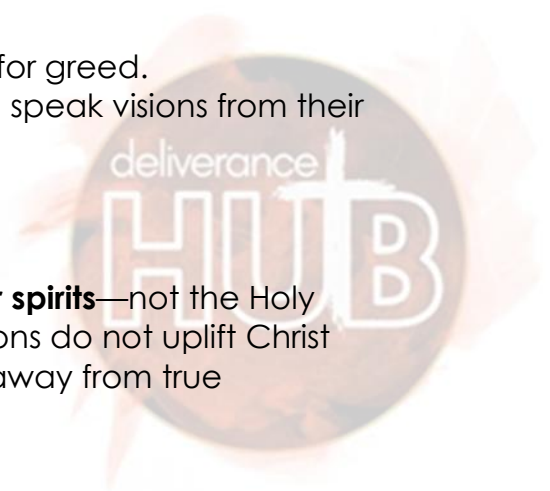
- Matthew 7:15 – Beware of false prophets.

Familiar Spirits and False Revelation

We affirm that **prophetic words sourced from familiar spirits**—not the Holy Spirit—are deceptive and dangerous. These revelations do not uplift Christ but instead manipulate, mislead, and draw people away from true discipleship.

Key Scriptures:

- Leviticus 19:31 – Reject familiar spirits.



- Acts 16:16–18 – Paul rebukes a spirit of divination masquerading as revelation.
- 1 John 4:1 – Test the spirits to see whether they are from God.

Summary

Deliverance Hub is committed to ministering like Jesus—without spectacle, without humiliation, and without elevating demonic voices. We uphold the prophetic ministry when it is rooted in humility, holiness, and the Holy Spirit, and we reject all counterfeit prophetic expressions sourced in pride, manipulation, greed, or familiar spirits.

9. FIXING OUR EYES ON JESUS AND REJECTING RABBIT HOLES, SPECULATIONS, AND DOCTRINES OF DEMONS

At Deliverance Hub, we are committed to **fixing our eyes on Jesus Christ at all times**. Our pursuit is not knowledge for the sake of curiosity, power, or spiritual thrill, but **knowing Christ and making Him known**. Victory and freedom come from the Gospel—not from exploring hidden theories, speculative teachings, or mystical revelations outside of Scripture.

Rejecting Speculation and the Pursuit of Forbidden Knowledge

We do not believe in pursuing knowledge about:

- aliens,
- Nephilim,
- watchers,
- hybrid beings,
- ancient cosmic mythologies,
- pre-Adamic speculations,
- “Ancient technology,”
- star-gate or dimensional theories,
- or other **spiritual dynamics rooted in speculation rather than Scripture**.

These teachings are **rabbit holes**—once entered, they are not easy to exit. One rabbit hole leads to another, drawing believers deeper into confusion, distraction, and what Scripture identifies as **doctrines of demons**.

Key Scriptures:

- 1 Timothy 4:1 – In the last days many will follow “doctrines of demons.”
- 2 Timothy 2:23 – “Avoid foolish and ignorant disputes.”
- 1 Timothy 1:4 – Do not pursue myths and endless genealogies that cause distraction.
- Hebrews 12:2 – “Fix your eyes on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith.”



The Simplicity and Attainability of the Gospel

We believe the Gospel is **simple**, accessible, and not reserved for those who have deep mystical knowledge. Victory should be attainable for the average believer, in any nation, culture, or circumstance.

When believers become consumed with speculative teachings, they move away from:

- the simplicity of devotion to Christ,
- obedience in daily life,
- practical holiness,
- and the work God has assigned them in their homes, workplaces, and communities.

Key Scripture:

- 2 Corinthians 11:3 – Beware of being led astray from the simplicity found in Christ.

Neglecting Real Life While Chasing Rabbit Holes

If someone is ignoring:

- the call of Christ in their **household**,
- their responsibilities in their **job**,
- their role in their **community**,
- meeting the **practical needs of people**,
but is instead spending their energy on chasing spiritual theories and hidden realms, they open themselves to **confusion, deception, and possible destruction**.

Jesus consistently called His disciples to faithfulness in the **real world**, not to speculative spiritual exploration.

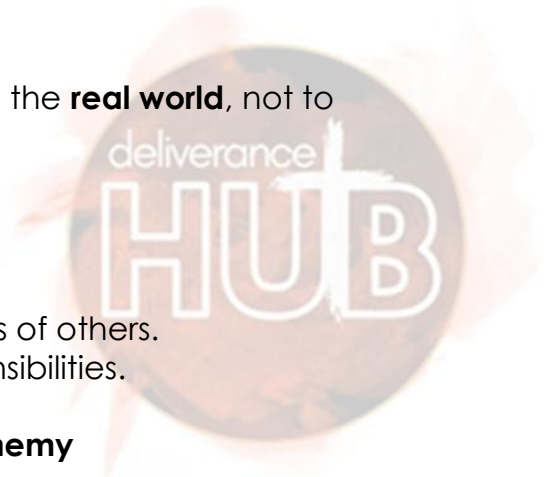
Key Scriptures:

Deliverance Hub encourages believers to stay rooted in the Gospel, focused on Christ, and free from the distracting rabbit holes that lead so many astray. The Holy Spirit guides us into **truth**, not into endless speculation. Our safety and our victory remain in **Christ alone**.

10. PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR SPIRITUAL GROWTH AND LIVING IN ALIGNMENT WITH CHRIST

Deliverance Hub believes that **each believer is solely responsible** for their spiritual growth and is personally **accountable to the Lord Jesus Christ**. Spiritual maturity cannot be outsourced or delegated. Every disciple must intentionally cultivate a living, dynamic relationship with Jesus.

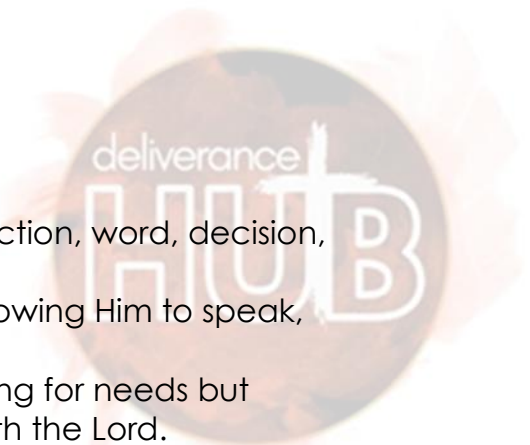
A Living Relationship with Jesus

- 1 Thessalonians 5:17 – Pray without ceasing.

Developing Discernment

We encourage believers to **develop spiritual discernment** so they will not be led astray by false teachings, deceptive manifestations, or doctrines of demons. Discernment grows through Scripture, the Holy Spirit, godly counsel, and obedience.

Key Scriptures:

- Hebrews 5:14 – Mature believers have their senses trained to discern good and evil.
- 1 John 4:1 – Test the spirits to see whether they are from God.

Hearing the Voice of the Lord

- Psalm 32:8 – “I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go.”

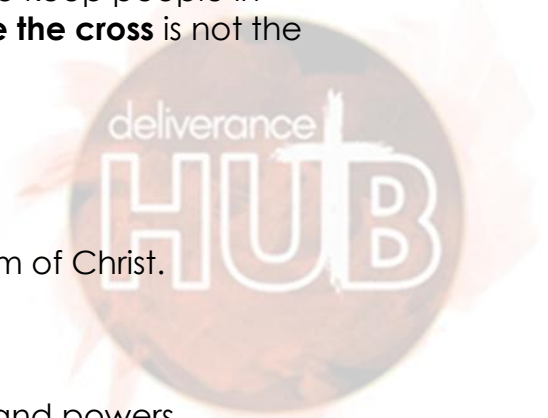
The Enemy Is Defeated and Disarmed

Key Scriptures:

Walking in Authority Through Alignment

Believers walk in authority **only when they are aligned** with:

1. **The Word of God,**
2. **The finished work of Jesus on the cross,**
3. **Full surrender to Christ,** and
4. **Obedience to the Holy Spirit.**

True spiritual authority flows from **alignment and obedience**, not from emotion, intensity, or religious performance.

Key Scripture:

- James 4:7 – “Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.”

Summary

Deliverance Hub is committed to raising mature disciples who know the Word, walk in surrender, cultivate prayer and worship, hear the voice of the Lord, and exercise the authority given to them through Christ’s finished work. The enemy is defeated and disarmed; believers are victorious when they live in obedience and alignment with Jesus.

11. IDENTITY IN CHRIST AS THE FOUNDATION OF VICTORY AND SPIRITUAL WARFARE

At Deliverance Hub, we believe that a believer’s **identity in Jesus Christ** is more powerful, more valuable, and more transformative than:

- any human strategy,
- any so-called “special revelation,”
- any cult-suggested insight,
- any human pursuit for spiritual answers,
- any visualization technique,
- any ritual,
- any good intention,
- or any human effort.

Identity in Christ is the cornerstone of freedom.

If a believer truly understands their identity in Jesus, **95% of the battle is already won.**

Victory Flows from Identity, Not Human Effort

Identity requires full surrender. We cannot add anything to achieve spiritual victory except:



1. **Alignment with the Word of God**, and
2. **The finished work of Jesus on the cross.**

Human effort does not produce deliverance; **obedience and submission** to Christ do.

Key Scriptures:

- Galatians 2:20 – “It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me.”
- Ephesians 2:10 – We are God’s workmanship, created in Christ.
- 2 Corinthians 5:17 – If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation.
- John 15:5 – Without Christ, we can do nothing.

Spiritual Warfare Must Never Remove Us From God’s Presence

We believe that **spiritual warfare must never pull believers away from the presence of God.**

Spiritual warfare is not an intellectual exercise, not a ritual, and not a constant war mentality. It is:

- done **only** in obedience,
- done **only** under the guidance of the Holy Spirit,
- never performed in fear, striving, or panic,
- and never meant to produce destruction in the believer’s life.

Key Scriptures:

- Ephesians 6:10 – “Be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might.”
- Romans 8:14 – Those who are led by the Spirit of God are the sons of God.
- 2 Corinthians 10:3–5 – Our warfare is spiritual and grounded in obedience to Christ.
- James 4:7 – Spiritual resistance begins with submission to God.

Summary

Our identity in Christ is the anchor of our freedom.

The cross is enough.

The Word of God is enough.

Obedience and surrender align us with the victory Christ already secured.

Spiritual warfare is not meant to overshadow our relationship with Jesus but to flow **from** it. When we know who we are in Christ, the enemy loses his influence, his intimidation, and his foothold.



12. SURRENDER TO GOD’S SUPREMACY, ROYALTY, AND FINAL AUTHORITY

Deliverance Hub believes in **full surrender** to the **royalty, supremacy, and absolute authority of God**. We are created beings, made in His image, and therefore we acknowledge that God alone is sovereign, eternal, infinite, and all-knowing.

Even when we do not understand everything, even when events in life do not make sense, and even when we have no answers for the most difficult questions, **God remains the final authority**.

God cannot be fully comprehended—and that is why he is worthy of worship

We affirm this foundational truth:

If we could fully understand God—comprehend Him 100%, explain Him entirely, and figure Him out in all His ways—He would not be worthy of our worship.

A God who can be completely understood is a God reduced to human level, and such a god is not worthy of bowing to.

We desire to worship a God who is:

- higher than we are,
- beyond our comprehension,
- whose wisdom surpasses our own,
- whose ways exceed human logic,
- whose decisions align with His perfect knowledge of our present and our future.

Key Scriptures:

- Isaiah 55:8–9 – “My thoughts are not your thoughts... My ways are higher than your ways.”
- Romans 11:33 – “How unsearchable are His judgments and His ways past finding out!”
- Psalm 145:3 – “His greatness is unsearchable.”

God Alone Is the Deliverer and Healer

Even though we pray boldly for healing, deliverance, and restoration, we acknowledge that **we are not the healer** and **we are not the deliverer**.

We pray because God commands us to pray.

We minister because God commands us to minister.

But **the outcome belongs to Him**.

Key Scriptures:

- Psalm 103:3 – God “heals all your diseases.”
- Exodus 15:26 – “I am the Lord who heals you.”



- Psalm 34:17 – “The Lord delivers them out of all their troubles.”
- 1 Corinthians 3:7 – “So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth.”

We obey the call to pray, but we surrender the results to the One who is sovereign.

Surrender Because We Love Him, Not Because of What We Gain

We choose to submit to God's decisions because:

- He knows best.
- He is all-knowing and eternal.
- He sees what we cannot see.
- His wisdom is perfect.

We do not worship God merely for what we can obtain from Him—blessings, healing, breakthrough, or freedom.

We worship Him because **we are in love with Him.**

He is worthy of worship **even when our prayers are not answered the way we desire.**

Key Scriptures:

- Habakkuk 3:17–18 – “Though the fig tree does not blossom... yet I will rejoice in the Lord.”
- Job 1:21 – “The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord.”
- Matthew 22:37 – Love the Lord with all your heart.

Summary

Deliverance Hub bows before a God who is higher, greater, wiser, and more glorious than human understanding. We surrender to His supremacy and trust His decisions—not because we always understand them, but because **He is worthy, He is sovereign, and we love Him.**
